

## **Newsletter: September 2019**

#### **Dear Friends**

As Summer turns to Autumn, churches across the country begin to celebrate their harvest festivals, and we look forward to ours during the first weekend of October.

The month of September is widely becoming known as a time when church communities are encouraged to reflect on their relationship with God's creation and our treatment of the environment.

We hear regular reports about the damage that is being done to our world through human activity. Bishop Jonathan has reflected on this in a blog posting in which he observes that human beings are actually very poor at recognising an emergency when its effects on us are not immediately obvious. He encourages each of us to take up something that will help us to recognise the cost of our actions on the environment:

'Do something now – something that costs. Money, time, energy, comfort: it doesn't matter, really, as long as whatever you do is a commitment. Make yourself committed; make this your emergency. Don't be taken in by the deceptive fact that your individual action won't make much difference. Yes it's true, but what will make a difference is when enough people think preserving our planet is their own priority, not someone else's. Then change will happen.'
