# Palm Sunday: I 0am Sunday 5th April

It will be helpful if you have with you a bible, a small cross and a candle. If you wear a cross, make this your focus for this act of worship. If you are not able to access the online resources, find a piece of joyful music to play as you prepare to worship.

## **Gathering**

We gather together in praise as the people did when Jesus arrived in Jerusalem on the donkey.

The president will greet us, and we respond in the usual way. Then we light a candle and remember all those gathered at this time in different places.

# Prayers for Lighting a candle

We light this candle to remind us that the love of God is like a light in our darkness.

We praise you heavenly Father, for brothers and sisters in Christ, joining from home to worship you at this hour.

#### Blessed be God for ever.

We praise you loving God, that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us Blessed be God for ever.

# **Introduction to Palm Sunday**

## The president introduces the celebration

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and resurrection. Today we come together to begin this solemn celebration in union with the Church throughout the world. Christ enters his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us go with him in faith and love, so that, united with him in his sufferings, we may share his risen life.

# Hold your cross saying this prayer

God our Saviour, whose Son Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem as Messiah to suffer and to die; let these crosses be for us signs of his victory and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

# **Collect for Palm Sunday**

# **Prayers of intercession**

For those in the darkness and agony of isolation, that they may find support and encouragement,

For those who, weighed down with hardship, failure, or sorrow, feel that God is far from them.

For those who are tempted to give up the way of the cross

That we, with those who have died in faith, may find mercy in the day of Christ,

Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

### Closing prayers

Said by the president alone, but with all invited to join in with the Amen May Christ crucified draw us to himself, to find in him a sure ground for faith, a firm support for hope, and the assurance of sins forgiven; and may the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among us and remain with us, and all those who we love and pray for, this day and always.
