


Service Booklet for Ordinary Time 2020 for use at home and in church

Please read the notes on the inside cover of this booklet



As you prepare to worship at home you might like to listen to or sing one of the suggested pieces of music for this Sunday. The service is led from the church using the Blue jeans video and audio conferencing package.

The guidance for those at home remains the same as in the previous version of this booklet.

Taking part in the service in church

A number of directions will be given throughout the service. Please follow them carefully.

In particular:

You must remain 2 metres apart from others who are not of your household or in your 'bubble'. The only exception to this is the point of receiving communion when this will not be possible

Please remain seated for the duration of the service unless you are invited to stand;

Please sanitise your hands as you arrive and as you leave. Please also sanitise them before and after receiving communion;

We are not permitted to sing and you are encouraged not to say the responses above the level of normal speech;

Please do not turn around to greet people while in church. During the peace please direct your peaceful greeting and gestures towards the camera for the benefit of people at home!

Please leave as directed and reserve any greetings to others until you are well clear of the exit and can meet in a socially distanced fashion in the church yard;

If you wish to pause for a short time of prayer before leaving, please wait until the rest of the congregation has left, before you leave.

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Prayers of Penitence

A minister uses a seasonal invitation to confession

All Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

The president says the absolution and we respond by saying the Gloria

Gloria in Excelsis

All Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Collect

¶ The Liturgy of the Word

Readings At the end the reader may say This is the word of the Lord. All Thanks be to God.

The Gospel

An acclamation may herald the Gospel reading.
When the Gospel is announced the reader says
Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.
All Glory to you, O Lord.
At the end
This is the Gospel of the Lord.
All Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

The Creed

We believe in one God,

the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,

of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord,

Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God, begotten, not made,

of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,

the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Peace

When invited to share a sign of peace please offer peaceful greetings and gestures to the whole gathered congregation. The congregation in church <u>should not turn</u> to face others in church.

Communion

A prayer of blessing for the gifts is said. The President prays the Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here.

All His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

These words, or an extended preface are said

President:	Father, you made the world and love your creation. You gave your Son Jesus Christ to be our Saviour. His dying and rising have set us free from sin and death. And so we gladly thank you, with saints and angels praising you, and <i>saying</i> :
All	Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.
President:	We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory. Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

We say this together, each at our own pace and in our preferred version.

The bread is broken

The words of distribution are said to all, and those who will receive the communion bread respond 'Amen'

The president and the people receive communion.

During the distribution, those who are unable to receive may say together

Prayer for Spiritual Communion

O Lord Jesus Christ, since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I pray that you would come spiritually to my soul. Come Lord Jesus, come and cleanse me, heal me, strengthen me, and unite me to yourself, now and for evermore. **Amen**

In church, music may be played during the distribution, at home psalms or other words from scripture may be read.

The post communion prayer

A minister dismisses us with the words:

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.
