

Sung Eucharist for Lent 2022



The Gathering

Processional Hymn

We stand to sing.

The president offers our worship to God: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All. Amen.

The Greeting The president greets the people:

The Lord be with youAll.and also with you.



We remain standing as words of welcome or introduction are said.

Prayer of Preparation

 Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayers of Penitence

We are invited to **sit** or **kneel** to make our confession; After an introduction and a short pause for personal reflection we say together:

All **Father eternal** giver of light and grace, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour, in what we have thought, in what we have said and done. through ignorance, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We have wounded your love and marred your image in us. We are sorry and ashamed, and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ who died for us, forgive us all that is past; and lead us out from darkness to walk as children of light. Amen

The president says words of absolution

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

We respond by **standing** to sing All Lo-rd, O Lord have me-rcy Lo-rd, O Lord have me-rcy Lo-rd, O Lord have me-rcy Lord, O Lord have me-rcy

The Collect (we remain **standing**) The president completes the gathering with a special prayer for the day

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading (we are invited to **sit**) At the end the reader may say:

This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Gradual Hymn

We **stand** to sing and face the gospel book and reader. We remain **standing** to hear the Gospel.



Gospel Reading

After it is announced we sing

Glory to you, O Lord.

After the Gospel has been read this response is used :

This is the Gospel of the Lord. All sing: **Praise to you, O Christ.**

We pause to reflect on the Gospel. The preacher invites us to sit

Sermon

The Nicene Creed (we stand to declare our faith)

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

> We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayers of Intercession

We **sit** or **kneel** to pray for the Church, the world, the needs of others and for ourselves.

This or another response may be used: Lord, in your mercy

All: hear our prayer.

The intercessions usually end with

Merciful Father...

All: ...accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.



The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace (we stand)

The president uses a seasonal sentence to introduce the Peace ending with:

The Peace of the Lord be always with you

We all respond: and also with you.

We are invited to exchange a sign of peace.

Offertory Hymn (we stand to sing)

A collection may be taken and presented for blessing.

The gifts of bread and wine are brought to the altar table.

The table is prepared. If the hymn ends before the preparation is complete the congregation may sit.

Taking of the Bread and Wine (we stand)

The president takes the bread and wine saying this or another prayer

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation through your goodness we have this bread to set before you, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life.

All Blessed be God forever

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation through your goodness we have this wine to set before you, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become for us the cup of salvation.


All Blessed be God forever

The Eucharistic Prayer (The Great Prayer of

Thanksgiving)

The Lord is here.

- All: **His Spirit is with us.** Lift up your hearts.
- All: We lift them to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- All: It is right to give thanks and praise.



Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us; he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us; and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now we give you thanks because you give us the spirit of discipline, that we may triumph over evil and grow in grace, as we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and *singing*: All sing: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus

All sing **Dying you destroyed our death,** rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory. And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of [*N and*] all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever.
Amen.

Breaking of the Bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ

All: Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Invitation to Communion

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and that he lives for you and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

All All Most merciful Lord your love compels us to come in. Our hands were unclean, our hearts were unprepared; we were not fit even to eat the crumbs from under your table. But you, Lord, are the God of our salvation, and share your bread with sinners. So cleanse and feed us with the precious body and blood of your Son, that he may live in us and we in him; and that we, with the whole company of Christ, may sit and eat in your Kingdom. Amen

The president receives communion. Those who will receive join in with the **Amen** and then all sing the **Agnus Dei**



All sing: Lamb of God you take away the sins of the world have mercy on us, have mercy on us.

Giving of Communion

Regular communicants in this or another church are welcome to receive here. All are invited to come forward for a blessing.

Currently only the communion bread is distributed and this takes place at the chancel step.

Please sanitise your hands before coming to receive.

Please move forwards using the central aisle and return to your seats by the side aisles.

During communion, hymns are sung during which we remain **seated**.

Prayer after Communion (we stand)

The president may say a Post Communion prayer.

We say together:

Father of all, we give you thanks and praise, that when we were still far off you met us in your Son and brought us home. Dying and living, he declared your love, gave us grace, and opened the gate of glory.

May we who share Christ's body live his risen life; we who drink his cup bring life to others; we whom the Spirit lights, give light to the world.

Keep us firm in the hope you have set before us, so we and all your children shall be free, and the whole earth live to praise your name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.
